










AYA'S COMFY COUCH

Okay! So, to start things off, can you tell us a little about yourself? Like for instance, how would you describe your persona, Kilzor?





Recently we had recurring fun and frustration as gentle-beans during the Fall Guys event in Final Fantasy XIV; this challenge starts in the Gold Saucer, leading players to the Blunderville Square and a special duty featuring adorably themed obstacle courses. Fall Guys will be coming back every now and then for those who want to continue the grind.

Speaking of new events, you can now pick up the quest "Bottled Fantasy" from the Medicine Merchant on the Steps of Thal (X:13.4 Y:9.2) to receive a free vial of Fantasia upon completion. Players must have completed the quest "The Scions of The Seventh Dawn" for their chance at their own Bottled Fantasy.

You can now also pick up the Pictomancer quest in Old Gridania outside of the Conjurers' guild and the viper quest in Ul'dah across from the main aetheryte. The Pictomancer quest is pretty adorable, featuring a Moogle as your guide. It has some super quirky questions and multiple choice answers, including some pretty funny responses and some that may pull on your heart strings from earlier expansions. The viper quest has you helping a viper who conveniently forgets you need money to buy things. You quickly get sent on the hunt all vipers chase, all while getting backstory on both your mentor and the vipers alike. It is a good build up and still has some pretty light hearted moments in all the seriousness. Both quests are very worth going through, and I personally think they are a bit quirky and fun in their own ways.



More great features include players being able to set their auto skip to only affect voiced dialogue, and the adjustments to the "say" objectives are also a personal favorite of mine; it is very helpful for players who are visually impaired or may have dyslexia. The bicolored gemstone cap has also been increased from 1,000 to 1,500. And regarding housing, homeowners can now also deny other players entrance to their properties as well as ban them. Free company and personal estates may have secondary rights-holders, four for free companies and three for private estates. Should you find it necessary to ban someone from your property, all characters owned by that player will be restricted from visiting.

On to other updates recently brought into the game! The numbers of aether currents in Endwalker areas has been reduced. New role quests and job quests have been added. You can now hide players when near and interacting with NPCS for quests, as well as hide party members. There are also now visual indicators when following NPCs for quests, which is great for people like me who struggle with finding the right distance.

These are just a few highlights of the many things added along with the Dawntrail story and female Hrothgars. May you all enjoy your voyage to the new world. I look forward to seeing you all there with new updates and events!





tek izzy: Lil' Nicholletta is a content creator that loves herself and cares about her audience. Her daily affirmations are what caught my attention; snippets of positivity to remind us what's important in an often toxic world. With her partner Lil' Raskal, they create funny videos, adorable pictures, and sometimes they involve horses! She's one of the good ones and I am glad she shared her story.

Lil' Nicholletta: Hey there, beautiful people! I'm Lil' Nicholletta. Video games and anime have helped shape who I am. Music has always been a big part of my life. Working with my voice from a young age made me realize I wanted to be a voice actor. Over the years, I've made some small videos, but I've always wanted to do something bigger.

I got into FFXIV during COVID, so I had plenty of time to learn video editing, with help from my partner, Lil Raskal. As I started making and sharing videos on Twitter and assisting DJAYams with social media, my skills grew.

Raskal and I decided that we wanted to work on our own content and that's when we decided to form "The Love Bunns". Our first video project recreated "The Dos Equis" commercials which we called "Dos Migos". We swapped out "The most interesting man in the world" with "The most interesting Hrothgar in the world". We branched out into other video projects and even started commission work.

How did you meet Lil Raskal?

I love telling this story!

Let me be real with you all—during my adventures, I found myself captivated by the "end game" like venues, glams, and DJs. I often found myself shaking my ass on the dance floor. One event hosted by The Goldsquad, I bumped into Raskal. I couldn't contain my excitement about the event, but Raskal, initially a bit shy, responded with a quick "yeah, okay, bye bye now" before teleporting away.

Little did I know, that quirky exchange marked the start of something special. Raskal and I spent the entire time busting moves and had a blast. That led to frequent chats, shared music, stories, and cheeky gposes. Lil Raskal was also DJing, so I made sure to catch their sets. Later, Raskal and DJAYams invited me to join their FC, "Dgens".

Raskal and I were inseparable. As we got to know each other better, Raskal dropped hints that I should make a move. Eight months into our relationship, I flew across the country to spend a week with Raskal. After that visit, we couldn't be apart. Please expound on your selfdescription of "moody introvert".

The "Moody Introvert" on my profile is a bit of a heads-up for anyone checking out my page. The "moody" part comes from being a Cancer-my mood swings get a little wild, so I warn new friends.

As for the "introvert" part, that's not entirely true. I can be outgoing when I need to be. I might be super outgoing, interacting with tons of people. but [then] I'll suddenly find myself wanting to be an introvert.

What is your gpose process?

I used to dive in with whatever idea popped into my head. I've learned to think ahead about how much effort I want to invest. Being a bit of a perfectionist, edits can take hours to get right. I like to visualize the final image. Then, it's about finding the perfect outfit. I might create a custom pose or use a premade and tweak it. I use Gshade and Relight to achieve the right atmosphere. I'll touch up the image in Photoshop. When it comes to video editing, I apply similar principles but with more focus on storyboarding.

Any final thoughts to share?

Anyone can learn anything if they're willing to put their mind to it. Don't limit yourself by assuming you can't. Remember that self-care is far more important than the number of likes on social media. Create content that genuinely brings you joy. Protect your peace of mind and stay hydrated!

Vaulting to Victory:

Mastering Eorzea finest Jump Puzzles

With a hop, skip, and leap of faith, we jump into a great gem called the Strange Housing Discord server! A one stop shop to find everything about jump puzzles. This community hub of player made-puzzles will fill hours of your day. From easy difficulty to legendary, from fun and silly to scary, they have a puzzle for every type of player. Let's hop into some questions with some of the Admins of the Strange Housing Discord server....

Interview with Bailey Kyn behemoth, **Emileigh** from Beastslayer from Excalibur(Emi) Lunar **Deimos** Gilgamesh, and Daranae Jenova


Helona: What does the discord have to offer players who join?

Bailey: Strange Housing dedicated to promoting playermade jump puzzles (and other similar things like racetracks). We have a website and some publicly available tools to track addresses (currently over 1000) puzzles interactive search tool and Google sheet. The Discord itself also has channels dedicated to sharing screenshots of clears, discussions around building and jumping techniques, and a bot that will help keep track of your clears and collection. badge also periodically have new seasons of our Parkour League which sets specific lists of puzzles to try to encourage people to jump the same puzzles together.

Helona: How does it help someone new (sprout level) get better at jump puzzles?

Bailey: Everyone is welcome to try any puzzles. The most important thing we try to do is rate puzzles between 1 (easiest) and 5 (hardest) difficulty to give players a general idea of what to expect before visiting. Some players will find more fun in lower difficulty puzzles, some only find fun in the hardest of puzzles. There are also tons of different game-physics techniques that can be involved in puzzles (like /sit or /doze-ing to teleport yourself to a bed/chair that you couldn't otherwise jump to; or using "phasing" physics to allow yourself to walk/fall through furniture). Some players might enjoy the more straightforward that include jumping, others will enjoy the more complicated puzzles that make you think.

We also have a written tutorial that goes over a lot of the strange housing techniques called The Em-Possible Jumping Guide. someone can't reach a puzzle (because of housing access to **Empyreum** or Shirogane neighborhoods,) they're always free to ask in Discord if someone can provide a friend teleport.

Helona: A brief history of the discord server?

Bailey: The server was created by Emerald Ares, who wanted to track all the player-made puzzles on the Primal datacenter; but it eventually grew to include builders from all over the world from every region/data center.

Helona: Do builders need to use mods? If so, what mods?

Emi: It is a common misconception that you need to use 3rd party tools in order to build in the void. It is possible to do almost anything manually.

Bailey: Builders do NOT need to use any 3rd party tools to build in the void. In fact, some of our builders have built all their puzzles entirely on console. Tools like BDTH (Burning Down the House) and Makeplace certainly make building and porting of puzzles easier, but you can absolutely build jump puzzles without them. We try to be 3rd party program neutral on the server (neither promoting their use nor shaming players for using them).

Lunar: The Discord was founded by Emerald Ares whose goal was to catalog anything goofy or out of the ordinary with housing; however this eventually developed into a catalog of void housing and, more so, jumping puzzles. The reason for joining the community is to find friends to jump with or to learn how to build puzzles. Additionally, we love seeing people clear and collect badges.


Daranae: We have dedicated channels for puzzle designers to share discoveries and techniques, as well as a channel for beginner builders to ask for help. One of the goals of many longtime members is to discover and encourage puzzle enjoyers to try designing a puzzle of their own. It's a niche hobby so it's important to find new blood to keep the community active and thriving. It's really fun to meet new people and see the enjoyment you bring to their XIV experience with your jump puzzles. I've met so many wonderful people (both jumpers and designers) over the years thanks to Strange Housing.

Emi: Our goal since Emerald handed leadership over to Dara, Bailey and me last year has been to make jump puzzles possible accessible as everyone. That is why the website, spreadsheet, and jumping guide were made. Our Discord merely provides a space in which to talk with other jumping enthusiasts and get more specific help on certain puzzles or in how to build them. It also serves to help host community jump puzzle events for everyone to join in, and most recently, a new badge system that allows people to collect badges for puzzles they have collecting done, much like Pokemon badges. Thank you for taking the time to help promote jump puzzles and the jumping community!

Vendetta: When did your Final Fantasy XIV adventures start focusing on music and streaming as an IRL career?

Potate: I started FFXIV around the time the 'Blizzard drama' happened, joining the influx of 'WoWfugees' as they're called. I didn't even know about the clubbing scene until about six months into playing. I loved the music, but wanted to hear more specific tracks, so I asked one of the DJs how to get started. From there, it took off! Doing it full-time for years wasn't the plan, but here we are.

Vendetta: When did your Final Fantasy XIV adventures start focusing on music and streaming as an IRL career?

Potate: In terms of music,

Sub Focus is one of my alltime favorites. I'm still learning and consider myself a DJing baby, but listening to other sets really pushes me to improve. Vendetta: You've had the unique experience of transitioning from DJing in Eorzea to performing for real-life audiences. How do these experiences compare?


Potate: Playing live is definitely scarier and more intimidating, but it's incredibly fun. Performing in Vegas was a highlight of my life, right up there with getting married.

Vendetta: As a trans female and activist, how do you feel that your experience as a DJ differs from your counterparts? heterosexual How do you use your platform to promote inclusivity and support for the LGBTQ+ community?

However, things are improving, and the love is spreading. It's definitely challenging being trans sometimes.

I help organize an event called TransFest with ZeonicSound, which we host during the weekend of Trans Day of Visibility. We feature entirely genderqueer and trans DJs. This past year, we had 36 DJs and hundreds of attendees! Events like this show people they're not alone and that they are welcome and valued. Hearing personal stories of people coming out during TransFest is inspiring and heartwarming.

I definitely feel that many of us get overlooked. I'm incredibly lucky to be





Vendetta: You recently Fantasia'd to Au'ra. Has the change from your iconic race affected your content or audience? And do you plan to stay Au'ra or can we expect to see a lalafell Potate in the future?

This is a tough one because I'm not even sure! All I know is,

Vendetta: How has the Billboard incident impacted you as a content creator? Can you share your thoughts? What was the actual event like?

The Billboard incident gave me some of the best memes and legacy, but also some of the worst trauma. The event was one of the biggest parties I've ever played, with over 1,000 viewers, and was a key factor in getting partner status. The week leading up to it was hell, but the party itself was an absolute blast.



Vendetta: I've been following your Twitter for some time and noticed that you have taken on some IRL creative hobbies. Can you talk about that?

I create space paintings with spray paint and have gotten deeply into photography. An interview with my mom on stream was a turning point—she encouraged me to pursue more creative endeavors, and that hit me deeply.

Vendetta: As a Twitch streamer with nearly 10,000 followers, what has been the most rewarding part of building your online community? Are there any standout moments or interactions that have particularly impacted you?

Helping people find a home where they feel accepted has been the most rewarding. People coming out to me, seeing another openly trans person doing this, helps them feel less alone. Plus, spreading the drum and bass love is amazing!

Vendetta: Do you plan on staying a Twitch entertainer for a long time? What's the endgame for you?

I plan on streaming in some capacity for a long time, but I'm also looking to take my art more seriously.

The story begins in 2023 with Eorzea's Got Talent 1 and a venue called Bards and Brews. At EGT1, both Scarletta Vendetta and Dan'ro Vulpe participated in the solo event. In the audience was another aspiring solo bard: Rhen'a Zhalahro. Talent recognized talent. A short time after, Cassie Black took the stage at Bards and Brews after Scarletta finished her set; again, talent recognized talent, and the four formed a group.

Now being an official quartet rock band, they needed a name. Midnyght Morning is a clever play on words that comes from a friend of Scarletta's, Midnyght, who passed away unexpectedly a few years earlier. Among other endeavors, this band name was a way to honor her friend's memory.

The story continues as Josiff Cujoh, having recently finished runner-up at Eorzea's Got Talent 3, performed at Amore Musicale's Classic Rock Festival. After some discussion and recognition, he also joined. The last piece of the puzzle to fall into place was Sylden Drather. Sylden was a friend of Josiff's and did not have to be convinced overmuch. Sylden became the drum beat of the band.

Rock bands do not become good performers by merely standing on stage, playing their instruments. Just like IRL bands, Midnyght Morning knew that practice was key to improvement. To gain some more insight, I asked member to describe band practice. In the beginning, there was a bit of a grind synergizing their music. Instead of changing their instruments to fit a piece of music, they learned to change a piece of music to fit their instruments. Once the initial practice gave them enough to perform a show, band practice became a fun time for each member to add a new song choice to their repertoire.

Fast forward through many practices, shows, and venues to June of 2024 and Eorzea's Got Talent 4! Midnyght Morning and its now-synergized members were ready to compete. They blasted an amazing version of Answers Nobuo Uematsu, melted their version of Linkin Park's New Divide for round two, and flew the audience through five expansions of FFXIV memories in round three. After an extremely compelling final round, and tense ten minutes of voting, Midnyght Morning finished third place! It was an amazing accomplishment for a young band. Having been around the band as their photographer, I felt pride for the six band members. Their reactions to the competition were genuine, and everyone involved could tell that the journey had been so much more important than the destination.

Since EGT4, Midnyght Morning has not stopped rocking. With the arrival to Tural, they were finally able to take a well-deserved break. But believe you me, this band is not done performing, inspiring, rocking, and creating vibes. They'll be back at a venue near you with fresh music and style.

The Art of Role playing Land of Final There are many ways to enjoy the world of Final

There are many ways to enjoy the world of Final Fantasy XIV. Some prefer to grind MSQ, others favor crafting and gathering, collecting every mount or minion they can, making the best glams they can,

being a part of raiding groups, and much more. One of these choices being roleplaying, which to many role players is another game all in its own. Much like Dungeons & Dragons, players will create their character along with their backstory and embody them as they act out different story arcs with another person or even with a group. While there is a large amount of freedom in how you roleplay, there are also certain etiquette guidelines players should follow to ensure a positive experience for everyone involved, which include the following:

Consent and Communication:

Always seek consent before involving other players in your RP scenarios. Clear communication about boundaries and expectations helps maintain a respectful environment.

Respecting Lore and Setting:

Stay true to the established lore of Final Fantasy XIV and the specific setting of Eorzea. Consistency enhances immersion and enriches the overall storytelling experience.

Avoiding Godmodding and Metagaming:

Godmodding (making your character invincible or omnipotent) and metagaming (using out-of-character knowledge in-character) disrupt immersion and undermine the collaborative nature of RP.

Staying in Character:

Distinguish between in-character (IC) and out-of-character (OOC) interactions. Respect IC continuity during RP sessions, and use OOC channels for discussions unrelated to the current roleplay.

Handling Conflict Maturely:

Inevitably, conflicts may arise between players. Handle disagreements or misunderstandings maturely and respectfully, focusing on narrative resolution rather than personal disputes.

If you are unable to find a group or partner wanting the same things out of your roleplay ingame, you can also search for Final Fantasy XIV RP discord servers. Find their 'Looking for RP' and character profile channels and post as much detailed information as you can. In the 'Searching for RP' channels, you do want to be as clear as you can be about what you are looking for and the type of RP you want.
